- *leaves windows open at night;

*has heavy objects available, like patio furniture, to throw against windows;

*has dense shrubbery close to the house in which invaders can hide;

*has low or no outdoor lighting.

The softer the target, the more likely a criminal will be to choose your property. The difference between a burglary and a home invasion is simple: a burglary

happens when you are not home. A home invasion occurs when you're there.

Reformed criminals working with security companies have said repeatedly that deterrents are what cause a criminal to pass by your house and select a softer target. The two major deterrents are evidence of a dog and/or evidence of a security alarm system.

Studies show that these visible deterrents are the #1 way to keep criminals away from your home. Guardian Security's sign, warning would-be intruders that the property is monitored 24/7, should be placed in an easily visible location.
