DOOR KNOCKER SCAMS How to spot a deceptive sales scam

Fraudulent door-to-door sales reps are known to use scams to lure you away from or cancel your Guardian Security account with deceptive tactics, high pressure sales techniques, and unethical business practices. We want to provide you with a few tips to protect you from security fraud and help you spot door-to-door sales scams before they happen.

Before you let them into your home, call us at 907.274.5275 to confirm their affiliation with our company. If they are unable to show identification, don't let them in.

• Don't give out your Guardian Security or personal account information to anyone. Be aware of questions about your personal information. Do not jeopardize your financial, medical, or personal identity.

- Don't allow yourself to be duped into signing unclear documents or contracts.
 Fraudulent door-to-door sales reps may claim to be from Guardian Security, but the paperwork may say otherwise. Be cautious.
 Do not sign any documents without careful review first.
- Listen for common "Deceptive Door Knocker" phrases used to gain access into your home.

"We are here from Guardian to check your alarm system" or "We are here to upgrade your Guardian security system." Guardian Security will ALWAYS call first if an upgrade or service repair appointment is needed.

Ensure your system is working Test your alarm system monthly!

- Notify Guardian Security at 277.1975 that you are checking your system. You will be asked for your PIN (Personal Identification Number).
- 2 Locate and turn off the breaker that feeds electricity to the outlet powering the alarm system transformer. Verify the touchpad is still functional, indicating the battery back-up is working.
- Open and close each door and window that is tied to the alarm system. Have someone assist by watching the touchpad. It should display when each zone is opened. Some systems display an asterisk (*), and you must press the status button to display the actual zone.
- 4 Arm and disarm the system from each touchpad.
- 5 Check each panic button.
 - Listen to the volume of your system. Is it adequate?
 - Check to see if the strobe light functions, if applicable.
 - Reset the system, disarming it.
- 6 Check with Guardian at 277.1975 to ensure signals were received.
- Test each smoke detector. A can of testing smoke can be obtained through Guardian Security for a nominal fee. Ventilate the detector after activation and reset the alarm. **note:** The detector will not reset while smoke is present.
- 8 Repeat step #6.
- 9 The backup battery should have carried the system through this testing process with no issues. If the system detects that the battery is low, it should be replaced.
- 10 Turn the breaker back on.
- 11 Contact Guardian at 277.1975 and let them know you are done testing. Even if it isn't fun, it is free, and it is a really good idea. Call our Central Station if you have any questions about testing your system.

An alarm system won't help if it doesn't work. Regular testing ensures its operation.
